

DATE FOR YOUR DIARY: PUBLIC DROP IN ON SATURDAY 24th SEPTEMBER

We hope the community, public and OSBs will take this opportunity to visit the school and meet with the Trustees to find out more about the progress and plans to bring back education and sustain the site. See how we are maintaining the fabric by making good use of the Business Management Centre, sports facilities, theatre, golf course and more, and plan to introduce new facilities such as a nursery later in the year.

We aim to hold brainstorming sessions to focus on how the community and OSBs feel we can use the buildings to best effect during this interim period, and to ask for volunteers to support viable projects.

This date coincides with the OSB St Beghians' Day. Also on the same day, The Parish Council is holding an event to showcase "St Bees – What Goes On" from 2-6pm in the Memorial Hall. Please do join us to make this a really positive event in the community.





Maintenance of Existing Assets and Infrastructure:

Life is slowly returning to parts of the school site, while we work on our mission to re-establish education here. Maintenance to essential systems such as boilers, buildings and IT equipment continues where necessary. It is a big step forward to have Sandy Rogers managing facilities. He is working through a challenging programme to keep assets in good condition.

Main developments have been:

- A comprehensive audit of the school's land and assets has taken place, to ensure that the Charity can deal with any queries and claims efficiently, and maximise the revenue where due.
- Agreement reached with the Golf Club, and a Green keeper (Craig) has been appointed.
- Tenants have been found for the Headmaster's residence and part of School House.
- We have re-opened the Business Management Centre.
- We have taken over management of the Swimming Pool, and resumed hire of sports facilities.
- Rosehill Theatre is using the Memorial Hall as a venue for their events this summer.
- A successful Spring Fest, and the return of Summer Fest between 1 – 5th August and 15 – 19th August.
- Trustees are in talks with other parties to allow residential hire over the summer months.
- A plan to open a nursery in the Prep School (School House) in September.

While we work to re-establish education on the site, we want to find ways to make use of the facilities to benefit the community. We welcome your suggestions.

For example, we have considered opening the school library as a study centre and resource for a couple of afternoons and e.g. Saturday morning each week. To do this, we would need volunteers to support the existing staff and Trustees. 

St Bees School Archive:

Importance of the Archive:

Following the notice of the school's closure in March 2015, there have been a number of enquiries about the fate of the school archives. The archives are an important part of the school's heritage and, to some extent, of the village's history. Many of the items have been donated to the school over the generations by former pupils, and to safeguard this important asset the archives in their entirety have become the possessions of the Old St Beghian Society to prevent their dispersal or loss. It is hoped to hold at least one exhibition of archive material in the school during the summer.


What is the Archive?

In general terms the archive comprises paper documents, both ancient and modern, of every description, photographs, framed and unframed, cups and trophies, paintings, old school clothing from different eras; in fact, memorabilia of all kinds. The opportunity was also taken of acquiring ownership of the furnishings and memorials in the school chapel, and the seats on the terrace with their presentation inscriptions. The OSBs would like to thank all those involved in this considerable task.

Preservation and Location of the Archive:

Most of the paper documents acquired are on long-term loan in the Whitehaven Records Office. This ensures they will be properly catalogued and professionally conserved. Other than this, and excepting the sale at auction of some of the pictures in the teachers' common room to raise much-needed funds for the Society, the rest of the material is presently held in secure storage until the future becomes clearer. Call for expressions of interest in future of St Bees School, West Coast Cumbria.



St Bees School, an independent boarding school with 432 years of history, temporarily closed its doors in June 2015. A new Board of Trustees has been established since the closure, and they have successfully secured a solid financial position as a closed school. Further, the school assets (including management centre, swimming pool, gym and pitches) are increasingly being used to generate income, strengthening this position further. This gives the Trustees the basis to actively seek a sound and enduring model for the resurrection of education on the site.

To this end, a vision and mission statement has been developed. The Trustees would welcome expressions of interest from parties who can align with this, and who have the capability of collaborating on a proposal to see education return to the St Bees site. Update on Potential Models of Education:

Archbishop Grindal was very clear in his vision when he left money to establish St Bees School. It was to educate children in and from (what is now) West Cumbria, and he entrusted delivery of this to a group of Trustees. 433 years later, a new group of Trustees has been assembled in the wake of the school's closure and our guiding principle is Archbishop Grindal's original vision. It is our commitment to do everything possible to resurrect education on the St Bees' site, and to ensure that any model is sustainable for the long term. That is the big "WHAT" we intend to do.

"HOW" we do that is not yet crystal clear, but various options are being examined closely. We placed an advert in the Times Educational Supplement recently (see top of page) asking for expressions of interest in the school site as an educational establishment. We have had several positive leads to add to our list for future discussions. This fulfils another commitment that we have made amongst ourselves as a Board. We will leave no stone unturned to find a solution and we will account to all interested parties for our actions when the time comes. By their nature, commercial discussions regarding possible models for the future have a confidentiality about them that we must respect. However, we want to share all that we can with you, and what we can say is that options of various types are being considered, and it is possible that a blend of models may be the solution:

- a school funded by the State out of Local Authority control i.e. a Free school
- a school under the umbrella of a Multi Academy Trust
- that St Bees site becomes a "Campus" for another school or for further education
- an Independent school again

We are at the start of the effort to restore education and it will be a long process. We have to test and ensure that what is developed is robust and fit for purpose - our determination is to see another 432 years of education at St Bees! You have heard elsewhere in this second Newsletter that our task of making the School site financially viable is going well. That gives us the platform to turn our attention to the educational side.

In conclusion, we cannot guarantee to anyone that we will be successful in what we are trying to achieve. But what we can guarantee is we will do everything we can, look at all possible angles and ultimately confer with and explain to everyone who has an interest what we think. We aim to be as transparent as possible. Our passion for St Bees School is undiminished following last year's events. It is important to note that the financial position is secure, and strengthening which is very positive in itself.

We are all amazed at the continued goodwill St Bees School inspires, and we set about our task with optimism and hope. We would love to have the opportunity to talk with you in more detail on Saturday 24th September, and hope you will join us then. Thank you so much for your feedback, and continued support.
